How do I discover my Spiritual Gift?

A marked difference between the New Testament scriptures and people today is that Paul and Peter assumed that people knew what their spiritual gifts were. Paul simply tells the Romans to use their gifts in certain ways (Rom. 12:6-8). The same is true of 1 Corinthians 12. Paul just tells them to use their gifts and not be puffed up about them. What do we say to people that do not know their spiritual gift?

First, ask what needs and opportunities for ministry are available? What gifts are most needed to build up the church? This idea is based upon the teaching that God places individuals with certain gifts in the church to build it.

Second, what desires and abilities do you have? Can others give advice or encouragement pointing in the direction of specific gifts? Additionally, has there been blessing in the past in ministering in a particular kind of service?

Third, you could also pray about it. James 1:5-6 says, "If any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask God, who gives generously to all without reproach, and it will be given him. But let him ask in faith, with no doubting."

Finally, if you are wondering about your spiritual gift, you should try ministering in various areas and see where God brings blessing. Try

teaching in a small group Bible study, or try your hand at evangelism, go visit the sick or the elderly, or plan special prayer times. You may find your gift.

But remember Paul clearly says that spiritual gifts are apportioned to each person individually by the Holy Spirit "as he wills" (1 Cor. 12:11) and that "God arranged the members in the body, each one of them, as he chose" (1 Cor. 12:18). In this way he reminds us that "the distribution of gifts is a matter of God's sovereign will."

The Webb CLG resumed their studies on Thursday, January 7th. As with the rest of Providence's Community Life Groups, there was an official break for the month of December.

That didn't keep us from serving together at the Culpeper Heat Shelter on Thursday, December 31st. During the course of the next twelve weeks, we will look for more opportunities to serve together, both in our community and in the bodies of our corporate families. According to Mike, service and outreach are very important to him, and have traditionally, therefore, been a large part of his groups.

"Some of my deepest Christian friendships are with people I've had the pleasure serving with side-byside. There is just something about being in the trenches with someone, watching them be the hands and feet of Jesus, that helps deepen those bonds of friendship," says Mike. "I truly enjoy this diverse group of people, and I think they enjoy



one another. Many of us have been together as a group, for the most part, for a long time." Our current group consists of folks from multiple local churches.

Serving together is only one aspect of our group, though. This trimester, we will be studying the epistles of John and Jude. Acts 2:42 tells us to devote ourselves to "the apostles' teaching." Our study in John and Jude accomplish that. But, more than just studying, our main goal is to look for the application. Our desire is to be conformed to the image of Christ. Our desire is to help carry one another's burdens.

Unlike tennis, the serve is performed underhanded, saving wear and tear on the shoulders.

The Landscaping Committee works for the church. Following the major changes to the shrubbery in design and replacement in 2020, the Landscape Committee's focus in 2021 is to maintain the current design, with some minor work in areas not addressed in 2020.

We are a fellowship of people who learn from each other in order to improve our home landscapes. So, come and join us. We love dirt/we love plants/we love people who get dirty working with plants.

GENERAL EXPECTATIONS & OTHER REQUIRED SKILLS:

- It involves a Month by Month work schedule/plan by the type of plant in the landscape. It is comprised of planned activities needed for that month, planting (thinning, relocation, replacement and new plantings), pruning, mulching, watering, fertilizing and pest and disease control.
- The work is generally completed based on the month of the year.
- Landscape maintenance cannot necessarily wait for a Saturday workday, we need people who can work during the week, as well as the people who can only work on weekends or evening.
- Pest and disease control need to be done when it happens.
- Pruning must be completed at specific time of the year based on the plant/ shrubs type and before we complete mulching and fertilizing.

Timing is everything.


Are uncomfortable meeting in person? We have a virtual option for you and a mask only option.

Is location the motivating factor in your choice? We have groups from Fauquier County to Madison County, as well as north and south Culpeper.




Many Christmas favorites were sung throughout the hour, each hymn emphasizing the Scripture read.
